
Geography - The Lake District

In this topic children will explore the United Kingdom using globes, maps, and satellite images. They will look at regions and locate the North West region, studying the different human and physical features of the area that we live in. The children will compare The Lake District to the Western United States.

Key Vocabulary

Capital - The city where the government of a country, state, or province is located.

Country - A large area of land where people live under the same government or have the same culture.

Globe - A globe is a spherical model of Earth.

Human features - things made or built by humans like cities, houses, roads, or bridges.

North America - North America is a continent in the Northern and Western Hemispheres.

Physical features - features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural. They would be here even if there were no people around.

Region - A large space or area.

The Lake District - The Lake District is a region and national park in Cumbria in North West England.

The Rockies - The Rocky Mountains, also known as the Rockies, are a major mountain range and the largest mountain system in North America.

United Kingdom - A nation in Europe made up of England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland.
