

# History – Year 1 – Kirkham High Street

## Topic Overview

We will learn out about how shopping has changed over time. We will start by looking at Kirkham High Street and comparing old photographs with Kirkham High Street today; talking to people who use Kirkham High Street and to people who live in Kirkham and remember what the shops were like in the past. We will learn about Kirkham Club Day which takes places every year.



## Important Vocabulary

High Street-	the main street of a town where the shops are.
living memory-	a time that can be remembered by people who are still alive.
decade-	equal to ten years.
Greengrocer-	someone who sells fruit and vegetables.
Haberdashery-	a shop that sells items used in sewing.
Supermarket-	a large shops selling different kinds of food and household goods.
refrigeration-	a way of cooling a space or an object to keep it at a lower temperature.
cash register-	a special machine used to count and store money in a shop.
