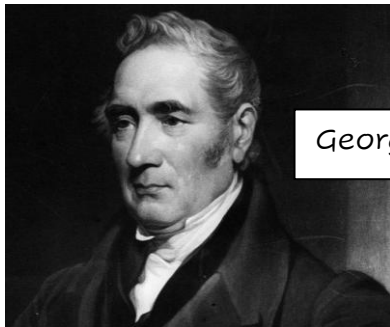


History – Year 2 – Victorian Seaside Holidays

Important Vocabulary

Victorian Era-	From 1837 to 1901 when Queen Victoria was the ruler of Britain.
Seaside-	A place by the sea, especially a beach or a holiday resort.
Tourism-	The operation of holidays and visits to places.
Century-	A period of 100 years.
George Stephenson-	An engineer known as the 'Father of Railways'.
Promenade-	a wide path or walkway, usually near the beach where people can walk.

The Victorian Era is named after Queen Victoria and started in 1837 and finished in 1901

George Stephenson built the first locomotive in 1814.

In 1825 the first railway to carry passengers opened this led to seaside towns expanding rapidly.
